




pharmaceutical contract research and

The global pharmaceutical contract research and manufacturing services market is set to grow by an average of 13.6% a year to 2017, by which time it will be worth \$136 billion, up from \$72 billion in 2012, according to new forecasts.


Market growth Healthcare Industry

Malaysia's healthcare market estimated \$1.2 billion in 2008 and is projected to reach approximately \$3.7 billion by 2020, at a CAGR of 9.5% (MOPI, 2014). World healthcare industry estimated trillion for the year 2014 and As per the market analysis it will raise up to \$7.0 trillion by 2020.



Market Value pharmaceutical industry

Asia and Indian subcontinents including Australia and south Africa pharmaceutical market going to see a highest growth rate at CAGR 11.4 - 14.4% compare to rest of the world as per the prediction. Malaysia's pharmaceutical market to be worth \$3.2 billion in 2013. The sector is expected to generate \$11 billion (RM35.5 billion) by 2020.



Fund Allotment For HealthCare

Healthcare expenditure in Malaysia could exceed USD20 billion. In the next five years (2015 to 2020), it is expected to grow at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 11%. Malayasia Government spending will focus on development of public healthcare infrastructure, chronic, infectious diseases control and treatment.
