

The South Asia Advantage

The global and South Asian textile and garment machinery sector is booming. The global textile machinery market is growing at 11.11% from US\$ 31.17 billion in 2014 to US\$ 42.753 billion in 2017 and is further expected to touch US\$ 54.679 billion by 2022.

South Asia is recognised globally as a garment powerhouse, manufacturing 80% of the world's brands and considered the next garmenting hub of the world. Also recognised as one of the best manufacturing, sourcing and distribution destinations for garments, textiles, accessories and finished products.

South Asia is also the fastest growing region in the world and as per the World Bank, best placed to lure garment and textile businesses with its lower wages and its demographic advantage of having the largest youth population (487 million) in the world.

India, the second largest textile manufacturing country in the world is also the second largest market for textile machinery and technology. The Indian market for textile machinery grew from US\$ 1.1 billion in 2012-13 to around US\$ 1.5 billion in 2016-17.

Pakistan's import of textile machinery grew by around 16.12% to US\$ 88.3 million in July-August 2018, from US\$ 76 million in July-August 2017.

Bangladesh saw imports of textile machinery grow 11% to US\$ 984.4 million in 2015-16. from US\$ 885.9 million in 2014-15.

Sri Lanka's overall machinery imports grew by 9% in 2016 to US\$ 1.8 billion

These are clear indicators of the growth in demand and imports of textile and garment machinery in South Asia.

The Sri Lanka Advantage

Sri Lanka's positive economy, industry and its logistical dominance - with 24% of the world container traffic from East to West moving though the Colombo port area – make for a tremendous advantage.
